[What is a CBCT scan?](#)

A CBCT scan is a 3D imaging technique used in dentistry to visualize teeth, jaws, and surrounding structures in detail.

### [What are the benefits of CBCT scan?](#)

CBCT scan provides a more comprehensive view than traditional 2D X-rays, aiding in more accurate diagnosis and treatment planning.

### [How does CBCT scan differ from traditional CT scans?](#)

CBCT machine uses a cone-shaped X-ray beam, while traditional CT machine uses a fan-shaped X-ray beam. This results in lower radiation exposure for CBCT scan.

### [How long does a CBCT scan take?](#)

A single CBCT scan usually takes between 15 to 30 seconds depending on the region of scan. The entire appointment may take about 15 minutes.

### [Is CBCT scan safe?](#)

Yes, CBCT scans are generally safe, with radiation exposure levels significantly lower than traditional CT scans.

### [Is CBCT scan painful?](#)

No, it's painless and non-invasive.

### [How should I prepare for a CBCT scan?](#)

Before your scan you will be asked to remove any jewellery, glasses, metallic items, removable dentures and hearing aids, that may interfere with the scan.

### [What happens during a CBCT scan?](#)

You are required to stand in the middle of the CBCT machine then your head will be carefully positioned and secured. Once the exposure button is pressed the scanner arm rotates around your head in 360 degrees imaging your teeth, jaws and other facial structures from multiple angles. The resulting images can be viewed and manipulated on a computer screen.

### [What happens after the CBCT scan?](#)

You can return to home/work and resume normal daily activities.

### [When will I get my CBCT scan reports?](#)

Normal reports are available within 48 hours; Express reporting would be available within 6-24 working hours of time. The report of soft copies will be sent both to the patient and doctor via e-mail id or to the whatsapp.

[Who reads and reports the CBCT scan?](#)

Qualified Maxillofacial Radiologists will read and report your scans.
